

By the President of the United States of America,
a Proclamation.

Whereas a Treaty or general convention of Peace, Friendship, Commerce and Navigation, between the United States of America, and His Majesty the Emperor of Brazil, was concluded and signed at Rio de Janeiro, on the twelfth day of December 1828, which Treaty or general convention is, word for word, as follows.

And whereas the said Treaty or
General Convention has been duly ratified
on both parts and the respective Ratifications
of the same have, this day, been exchanged,
at Washington, by James A. Hamilton,
Acting Secretary of State of the United States,
and the Chevalier J. Silvestre Rebello,
Charge d'affaires of His Majesty the Emperor
of Brazil, on the part of their respective
Governments;

Now, therefore, be it known, that
J. Andrew Jackson President
of the United States of America, have
caused the said Treaty or General Convention
to be made public, to the end that the same,
and every clause and article thereof, may
be observed and fulfilled with good faith,

by the United States, and the Citizens thereof.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand, and caused the Seal of the United
States to be affixed.

Done at the City of Washington,
this eighteenth day of March, in
the Year of our Lord, one
thousand eight hundred and
twelve, the year of the Independ-
ence of the United States
Fifty-third.
